The Three Great Lights of our Breed

- As a people our Wolfhounds have walked beside us on the Island for Ireland for millennia. They have evolved alongside us as we as a people have evolved.
- The first written account of the Irish Wolfhound appears in 391AD
- Captain Hugh Richardson Tyrone
- Sir John Power Kilkenny
- Captain George Graham Kilkenny & Gloucestershire.
- The first breed standard was written in 1885 and a breed club formed.
- In Dublin at the Irish kennel club show in 1879 the first classes were given to the Irish Wolfhound.

The Importance of our Breed Standard

- It is a picture in words, of how the Irish Wolfhound should **look**, **perform** and **behave**.
- It is the template that all breeders must breed to.
- It is the degree of excellence all judges must judge to.
- It **educates** individuals, new to the breed and acts as a single source of truth.
- It is the essence and foundation stone of our breed, on which all strategic initiatives **must** be based.

Risks to our Breed Standard

- Inexperienced breeders with no knowledge of the breed standard.
- Inexperienced "Qualified" Judges with little or no knowledge of the Breed Standard.
- Judging to "Show Ring Fashion Trends" which leads to breeding to achieve those trends.
- Champion Chasing (Mating too many to too few)
- Deliberately misinterpreting the breed standard to justify hounds who don't meet the breed standard and/or are not fit for purpose.

In Conclusion

- The future is bright, we have excellent people in our breed who dedicate their efforts to the safeguarding of our breed and building on the work done by those who have gone before us.
- To Ireland and the Irish, the Irish
 Wolfhound is an integral part of our
 heritage, they are part of who we are as a
 people and a nation. It is for this reason
 that the Government of Ireland granted
 them protected heritage status. They
 feature on our currency and now on our
 passport.
